BSc Rehab, HPCS, AHA Faculty Member, BHSAI, CanTRA Coach/Examiner



Pippa is a Pediatric Physiotherapist and has a diploma in Physiotherapy from the UK and a Bachelor of Science in Rehabilitation from University of British Columbia.

Pippa has her Clinical Specialty in Hippotherapy HPCS and was a founding member of Valley Therapeutic Equestrian Association (1983) in Langley B.C. She continues to be involved in the Association today.

Pippa currently works with First Nations children in five communities around Pemberton. She has lectured in Australia, New Zealand, Greece, USA and Canada.

In her spare time, she rides her Bashkir Curly horse, Katie, plays guitar in a band, trains her standard Poodle to be a service dog and enjoys traveling.

Overview of Pippa's Presentation:

In this presentation we will address the key points of assessment of the rider, in order to set attainable goals. We will do this by answering the following questions:

- Why is it important to set realistic goals?
- How do we set measurable and functional goals?
- Are you able to listen to the rider and together decide what you want to achieve?
- Are your lessons boring?
- · How can you keep the rider engaged and active?

In the practical presentation we will look at some common rider postural issues and some fun ideas of how to influence the rider to meet the goals.

In the 1990's Steve helped run a therapeutic riding program in Northumberland County, ON.

Steve was a riding instructor at Cornell University Graduate School, and a member of the Jr. Varsity Polo Squad.

He competed with Arpeggio up to 4th level Dressage, national classes for 2023 and 2024 show seasons. Steve also volunteers at Sunrise.

In 2023 and 2024, Marley competed with Arpeggio (owned by Steven Mock) in national-level para dressage classes at events such as Angelstone, Palgrave, Saddlewood, and FEI classes at the Ottawa CPEDI 2* and 3*.

Marley has trained with Ute Busse and is currently listed on the Equestrian Canada Para Dressage Talent ID Squad, having been declared for the 2024 Para Paris Games.

Between 1997 and 2004, Marley trained with Gina Smith, an Olympic bronze medalist for Canada and a member of the Pan Am Games gold medal team in dressage.

Arpeggio is a 16.1 hh chestnut thoroughbred gelding, born in 2005. He has competed in Grade V para dressage, as well as national and FEI level classes. Additionally, he has shown in Fourth Level dressage at national classes.

He chose to survive and thrive in spite of society's perception of people with disabilities in the 1970s. He is a Paralympic champion and record holder in the 400-meter event, a husband and the father of two.

Jeff is an inductee in the Canadian Disability Hall of Fame, the Windsor-Essex County Sports Hall of Fame and the University of Windsor Sports Hall of Fame. He is also a proud recipient of the Senate of Canada's Sesquicentennial Medal.

An award-winning journalist, with over 1000 published features to his credit, Jeff founded the acclaimed Disability Today Publishing Group delivering information and motivation to live life actively, independently and confidently.

Jeff is a respected educator, advocate and highly sought-after public speaker. As a presenter and facilitator, he provides audiences with disability literacy education from the lived experience perspective.

Mike St. Denis



Mike started riding when he was 12. Having gone on a trail ride with family he fell in love with horses. When his family moved out to the country in Puslinch they had 2 cows, and Mike would ride around on them. His parents said, "We better get this kid a horse".

By 1995 Mike was in his early twenties and was competing in Eventing at the international level. His life drastically changed when he suffered a very serious head injury which almost ended his life and left him with permanent life altering physical and cognitive changes. Mike's recovery was slow, but it did surpass all the Doctors' expectations. He even continued to ride horses and do some coaching. But the riding was more recreational now. He felt fortunate just to be able to still get on a horse and ride around a bit.

In the past year, riding, in particular mounting and dismounting had become a real struggle for Mike. He has been volunteering at Sunrise helping in the barn, since 2022, and has now begun riding in the Sunrise program. This has been a lifeline for Mike, enabling him to still ride, when it looked like he was never going to be able to ride again.

Saddle Maker | French Saddle Repair Expert | Creator of Christian Lowe Leather Care | Host of The Saddler's Post Podcast


